POSITION SUMMARY

This is a general studio-support position. Schedule, tasks, and work location may flex in response to studio needs and volunteer availability. Tasks will range from in-studio cleaning and maintenance to research projects that may be done remotely. The initial agreement is for 6 months, at which point it may be reviewed and renewed.

REQUIRED

• An interest in the jewelry/metals field

- Willingness to undertake a wide range of tasks including in-studio cleaning and computer-based research and writing assignments
- A minimum 6-month commitment and general availability for 2-3 hours per week
- Ability to take direction and then work independently with minimal supervision
- Patience, flexibility, and a positive demeanor
- Punctuality, reliability, and organizational skills
- Ability to lift up to 50lbs, climb ladders, and perform routine maintenance tasks in an environment that includes various dusts and chemicals
- Responsiveness by email, clear and timely record-keeping
- "By-the-book" adherence to Pratt policies and J/M studio safety procedures
- Willingness to learn about Pratt's Code of Conduct and Racial Equity initiative Commitment and to foster a universally welcoming and respectful environment

DESIRED

- Basic knowledge of jewelry/metals-related topics, trends, processes and skills
- Research, editing, proofreading skills
- Relatively flexible schedule
- Eye for detail, graphics, and display
- Some familiarity with Pratt
