

2018 Summer Youth Art Camps

All youth art camps meet Monday – Friday, 9 am – 3 pm (5 sessions). Camp fee is \$355 per week. After-care is available 3 – 6 pm for \$20 per day.

DATES	DESCRIPTION
Youth Art Camps for Ages 7–9	
SESSION 1 Comics and Graphic Novels (Ages 7 - 9) 07/09 – 07/13	Write and develop an idea of putting characters together leading up to the creation of a class comic book. FULL, WAITLIST AVAILABLE
SESSION 2 Scissors, Tape and Glue Everything (Ages 7 - 9) 07/16 – 07/20	This camp is all about putting things together and building. They will transform drawings into 3 dimensional works of art while working on concepts like visual balance and narrative. Students will create collages, wall-hangings, buildings, spaceships and cars out of cardboard, plastic, paper, wood and much more.
SESSION 3 From Recycle to Art (Ages 7 - 9) 07/23 – 07/27	Reinvent everyday objects into new and beautiful artistic creations. Students will find inspiration in plastic bottle caps, plastic silverware, old magazines and newspapers. The sky's the limit for our imaginations as we reinvent disregarded items into functional and decorative pieces. This week will focus on taking things apart and putting them back together to make new and imaginative art.
SESSION 4 Past and Present Artists (Ages 7 - 9) 07/30 – 08/03	Step back in time, and journey through the world of art! Each day will focus on a different artist and students will create their own work using similar inspiration and techniques. Students will explore perspective, abstraction, point of view and cubism through the use of traditional drawing and painting materials.
SESSION 5 Develop your own Characters (Ages 7 - 9) 08/06 – 08/10	Use your imagination to create your own characters! Who is he/she/them? What do they like? How do they dress? Students will develop a character and explore techniques using pencils, markers, ink, paint and mixed media. On the first day students will decorate a work box for storing all their ideas and work in progress. By the end of the week each student will have finished characters and several unused parts and pieces they can continue playing with after the camp is over.

Youth Art Camps for Ages 10–12	
SESSION 1 Comics and Graphic Novels (Ages 10 -12) 07/09 – 07/13	Write and draw an idea and turn it together elements symbols. Using of telling stories of a class comic book. FULL, WAITLIST AVAILABLE
SESSION 2 Cave Art to Street Art (Ages 10 -12) 07/16 – 07/20	By studying many types of art and materials, students will make their own classics and monuments. Students will explore perspective, abstraction, and non-western working methods. Each day will have a new project with new materials while students learn about drawing and painting materials.
SESSION 3 Architecture Out of the Box (Ages 10 - 12) 07/23 – 07/27	Design and create buildings of the future inspired by wild imagination! Students will design and construct a cityscape and outdoor environment using found objects, paint, paper, and glue. Explore techniques such as stamping, collage, construction, papier-mache, painting, and drawing. Students will think outside the box in this week all about construction.
SESSION 4 Pop Art (Ages 10 - 12) 07/30 – 08/03	Explore drawing, the style of Pop Art. Using images from objects as inspiration will create collage. FULL, WAITLIST AVAILABLE
SESSION 5 Storytelling with Comics (Ages 10 -12) 08/06 – 08/10	Create characters and analyze a variety of understand characters storytelling students an idea. Using elements would with pencils. FULL, WAITLIST AVAILABLE
