

**PONCHO**  
**Artist-in-Residence Program**  
**2009 - 2010**

**Program Description:**

Four artists residing in Washington state will be chosen to receive a residency at Pratt Fine Arts Center where they will have the opportunity to take advantage of Pratt's equipment-rich facility and professional instruction to produce their own work. Selected artists will receive a \$500 honorarium and \$1000 credit to be applied either to classes or studio rental at Pratt Fine Arts Center. Artists-in-Residence (AIRs) using the facility as independent users must complete a studio rental test prior to using the tools or equipment. The residency will culminate in a public component, including exhibition of current works, a lecture of past and present work and presentation of accomplishments while in residence at Pratt by each individual artist.

**Eligibility:** Pratt board members and their families, as well as Pratt staff are not eligible to apply. Instructors are eligible. Up to two Pratt scholarships can be awarded to any given individual during his or her lifetime.

**Application:** All applications must include a typewritten project proposal, not to exceed one page, explaining:

- What you intend to accomplish during the scholarship year
- How your proposal relates to your previous experience
- How this scholarship could enhance your artistic development and goals

Also include:

- Up to 6 images (see guidelines) of current work, each labeled with a number and ordered as you wish to have them viewed. Also include your name and the title of each piece.
- An image list, including the title of the piece, its dimensions, medium, and the year it was produced. Please note that Pratt may use your images for promotional purposes. If applying for more than one scholarship, only one set of images is required
- A current resume or brief biography
- A completed scholarship application form
- 3 copies of entire application
- Pratt can not be responsible for the return of materials submitted

**Artist Selection:**

A jury of artists and arts professionals will select the recipient with emphasis given to the applicants' artistic merit and their ability to clearly convey their intended accomplishments during the residency. Preference will be given to artists who propose projects that explore media different from that which they typically use. Artists of color are particularly encouraged to apply.
