



Jon and Mary Shirley Glass Scholarships 2009-2010

Scholarship Background: Through the generous support of Jon and Mary Shirley, Pratt is pleased to offer these two merit-based scholarships.

Scholarship Description: Each award includes \$1,875 credit for classes, workshops and/or studio rental in the Pratt glass program (including the hot shop, warm shop, cold shop and use of the sandblaster). If the recipient chooses to use the scholarship for studio rental, they will be required to complete a rental test prior to using the facility. The awards must be used between September 1, 2009 and August 31, 2010.

Eligibility: This scholarship is awarded annually to emerging glass artists 18 years or older who wish to pursue new or experimental directions with their medium, either independently in the glass shop or through glass classes or workshops. This scholarship is not awarded to individuals pursuing production work. To qualify for this scholarship, applicants must have enrolled in and completed a Pratt glass class or workshop in the past calendar year, or have worked in the hot shop as an independent user with an access card in the past calendar year. Pratt board members and their families, as well as Pratt staff are not eligible to apply. Instructors are eligible. Up to two Pratt scholarships can be awarded to any given individual during his or her lifetime. A jury of artists and arts professionals will select the recipient.

Application: All applications must include a typewritten project proposal, not to exceed one page, explaining:

- What you intend to accomplish during the scholarship year.
- Specify what project you will undertake, which classes you hope to take, what new skills or techniques will be learned or practiced.
- Why you need scholarship funding to complete your projects.

Also include:

- Up to 6 slides or jpegs (see guidelines) of current work, each labeled and numbered and ordered as you wish to have them viewed with your name and the title of the piece. Please note that Pratt may use the images provided in future marketing materials. If applying for more than one scholarship, only one set of images is required.
- A numbered image list, including the title of the piece, its dimensions, medium, and the year it was produced
- A current resume
- 3 copies of entire application
- A completed scholarship application form
- Pratt can not be responsible for the return of materials submitted

Applications will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- The feasibility of applicant's project within the time and space limitations of the Pratt glass studio
- The connection between the applicant's work shown in their slides and the proposed projects
- The applicant's dedication to the field of glass as demonstrated through level of skill, length of study or practice, and gallery activity
- Artistic merit of past work (as indicated in images)
