Study Abroad: Pajarito Jewelry in Guanajuato

Pratt Fine Arts Center

Learn the techniques behind an historic style of Mexican jewelry in one of Mexico's most beautiful cities. A seam of silver runs through Guanajuato's bedrock, history, and culture. Rich mineral deposits led to the city's founding in the 16th century and a massive silver vein discovered in 1750 funded many of the stunning Baroque buildings that have earned it recognition as a UNESCO World Heritage site.

That opulence is also reflected in Guanajuato's personal adornments. Our class will focus on a distinctively baroque style developed during Guanajuato's colonial period. For joyería pajarito or "little bird jewelry," "...brooches and earrings are built up on several planes...the surfaces all naturalistically tooled and all held together with wire tendrils. On this flowery mass a small bird perches, its wings incrusted with turquoise and its eye a ruby-red stone...The floral design is then riveted to an architectural framework of scrolls and broken curves with tear shaped drops" (Mary L. Davis, Mexican Jewelry).

Our instructor Francisco García-Guevara is a master jeweler who learned the style from his own father. Students will work in silver to creative a pendant with several layers and elements, experiencing sandcasting, die-stamping, chasing, engraving, patination, and soldering.

We'll attend class each weekday until 2pm, then break for lunch and sightseeing. One afternoon we'll head up to the northern suburbs to visit La Valenciana, a still-active silver mine that produced more than 30% of the world's silver for over two centuries. From our four-star hotel in the center of downtown you can easily enjoy Guanajuato's renowned music, theater, restaurants, and winding cobblestone streets.

Prerequisite: Some silver soldering experience.

Please note: Guanajuato is extremely hilly. This trip is not recommended for travelers who have difficulty climbing stairs or walking distances over uneven terrain.
