

FISCAL YEAR 2025 IMPACT REPORT

Dear Pratt Fine Arts Center Community,

Fiscal year 2025 was a year of **care, growth, and celebration**—advancing our mission through community-centered programming and artistic excellence.

Following the completion of our strategic plan in June 2024, **we entered FY25 with renewed purpose**. We built stronger internal support systems by launching our first Instructor Orientation Day and hosting our annual Staff Retreat, improving internal and external communications and processes, and making meaningful progress toward our goal of increasing physical accessibility within our studios.

Meanwhile, our **programs flourished and reached more people than ever**. We expanded study abroad opportunities to Japan and Spain; offered free public programs including a trans reading night, Cascadia Cup Club in the Hot Shop, and jewelry and metalsmithing programming with the Seattle Metals Guild; and introduced new 2D courses in fiber arts and Risograph printing. Steve Jensen Studios hosted our first-ever Pratt Pride Party, and our Youth & Teen Summer Camp saw record enrollment. We also expanded scholarships, including the new Webber/Tompkins Scholarship in Glass, **further increasing access to the arts**.

These accomplishments were made possible through the **generosity of our donors and civic grants** that value cultural sustainability. Highlights included 4Culture’s Doors Open support and our 2025 Fine Art Auction, which amplified Pratt’s mission and engaged thousands of artists, learners, neighbors, and community members.

As we celebrate Pratt’s 50th anniversary in 2026, we mark this milestone through storytelling, gatherings, and gratitude—**honoring our shared commitment to the artists, makers, and students who will shape the next 50 years**. Together, we uplift one another—as creators, learners, and supporters united by Pratt’s mission. Through this shared commitment, we keep creativity and learning alive on our campus and throughout our greater community.
